South West Garo Hills

DPMU SWGH conducted field visits to different CLLMP villages for the implementation of forest fire control lines and for inspection of the construction of ongoing RCC check dam under the SRES catalytic fund.







North Garo Hills

DPMU NGH visited the Aruakgre Turtle Sanctuary to check on the progress of the construction of a protective wall and the access road. Besides this, the team also conducted a field visit to Doba Apal, one of the CLLMP villages, to document the CNRMP and examine the location of the village's permanent community nursery and water tank.

- Demonstration of Geranium production and Early Mint Technology in North Indian Plains.
- Introduction of medicinal and aromatic plants (MAPs) in traditional cropping system.
- Display of farmer-centric technologies developed by CSIR Institutes.







The Institute of Natural Resources, Meghalaya being one of the major partners of CSIR-CIMAP under Aroma Mission also participated in the Mela with a total of 16 participants comprising of farmers and officials from INR, MegLife and MBMA.
