Innovative Hubs Launched in West Garo Hills, Meghalaya: MeghFarm Processing Hub and Tikrikilla PRIME Hub



On February 10 2024, the Honorable Meghalaya Chief Minister Conrad K Sangma officially inaugurated the MeghFarm Processing Hub and Tikrikilla PRIME Hub at Khamari, Tikrikilla, West Garo Hills, marking a significant shift in regional agriculture. With a processing capacity of 80 to 100 tons, MeghFarm aims to reduce agricultural wastage and enhance market value, representing a Rs. 14.5 crores investment by the Government of Meghalaya (GOM) and the Meghalaya Basin Management Agency (MBMA), Megha-LAM Project. Joined by esteemed dignitaries, including Power Minister A T Mondal and Lok Sabha MP Agatha K Sangma, the Chief Minister emphasized the hubs' role in empowering local farmers and entrepreneurs through mentorship programs, with the goal of creating a sustainable economic ecosystem. This initiative is poised to uplift numerous livelihoods in the Garo Hills region.











Community Led Landscape Management Project (CLLMP)





On February 12th, 2024, the Ri-Bhoi District Project Management Unit (DPMU) convened a meeting with all members of the Village Natural Resource Management Committees (VNRMCs), delivering a thorough briefing on the transfer of VNRMCs and their associated assets to new committees or associations. The Deputy Manager (Social Management) emphasized the importance of the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU), highlighting the necessity of its submission by February 15th, 2024, as the project nears its conclusion. It is vital for all involved parties to adhere to this deadline to ensure a seamless transition. Failure to submit the MOU on time could disrupt the handover process and hinder the project's closure. Therefore, prompt action is crucial to ensure compliance and efficiency. Members are urged to promptly address any inquiries or concerns regarding the MOU to facilitate its timely submission. The successful completion of this handover process is crucial for the uninterrupted continuation of operations within the VNRMCs.



A one-day orientation program was conducted for MegARISE staff, a KFW-funded project, at the MegLIFE office in Shillong.
