AWARENESS AND WORKSHOP PROGRAMMES ON IVCS

3 Days training on Preparation of Business Plan & Action Plan for IVCS (Garo Hills Region) was conducted at SMELC, Dakopgre, Tura, West Garo Hills from 21st to 23rd February, 2024. It was organized by the Rural Finance, MBMA. The training was conducted by the mater trainers and was attended by 38 nos. of IVCS in charge from 11 Districts of Garo Hills.





On February 24, 2024, a Financial Literacy Programme (FLP) was conducted at Lumpohsiej under the Mookynniang Integrated Village Cooperative Society (IVCS). Concurrently, an MC meeting took place at Sohphoh IVCS. During the MC meeting, discussions centered around the business plan, reviewing the CMC working capital, and determining profit sharing within the IVCS.



On 22nd February 2024, inspections were carried out, including visits to tourism (Homestay) construction sites at Mawmluh and Laitmawsiang, a Farmer's Market inspection at Diengkynthong, and examinations of three tourism project sites managed by the respective Cooperative Societies under Mawsynram Block.



Community Led Landscape Management Project (CLLMP)





On February 26th, 2024, an orientation session on AgroForestry-based Carbon Credit was held at Science Hall in Nongpoh, Ri-Bhoi District. Organized by the IORA team, the session was led by Shri officials. Ambuj Shukla and Smt. Megha Shruti. Their presentation aimed to highlight the various benefits of carbon credits, with the goal of raising awareness among the attendees. The event saw a turnout of 56 participants, and the IORA team received assistance from the CLLMP Ri-Bhoi DPMU staff.

Overall, the orientation session was successful in promoting understanding and appreciation for AgroForestry-based Carbon Credit initiatives, encouraging participants to highlight the importance of cooperation between financial institutions, non-governmental organizations, and local communities in achieving shared goals related to sustainability and carbon reduction.



Ri-Bhoi AM-KM visitited Mawkyrdep village under Bhoirymbong block & Mawdiangum Village under Umling block. The Knowledge Management team of Ri-Bhoi focused on providing comprehensive guidance and support to the videographers tasked with documenting the implemented sites for the upcoming Natural Resource Management (NRM) Library.

This visit held profound significance as it coincided with a critical phase of the project, with the NRM Library nearing completion. Thus, ensuring a thorough documentation was paramount to accurately capturing the essence of the implemented initiatives.

were undertaken in the Lotnagar reserve located in Baghmara. These tasks likely involved monitoring, reporting, and verifying environmental or conservation efforts within the reserve.

Subsequently, on February 25, 2024, MRV activities were conducted in the PES MRV Pollendro Kharkutta Block. Similarly, these activities would have been centered on monitoring, reporting, and verifying environmental or conservation initiatives within this specific block.

Taken together, these MRV activities reflect a coordinated effort to evaluate and manage environmental resources and conservation endeavors across different regions. Meetings are underway with beneficiaries of the payment for ecosystem services scheme. The sessions encompass guidance on effective fund utilization and timely submission of Utilization Certificates (UC).







Meeting Update (23/02/2024)

Sir Rupankar Marak (DFO), MFS, led the discussion in our recent gathering! Here are the highlights:

Selecting two applicants/block with a strong commitment to CRF norms is a top priority.

The selection process involves input from Nokmas, executive members, and villagers, leading to the election of village officials and a joint account setup.

Approval from Nokma and clan members, alongside boundary verification and socio-economic surveys, is crucial.

Applicants must sign a Non-Judicial form upon acceptance, with legal notices issued as needed.

Careful beneficiary selection is emphasized to prevent conflicts.

GFAs are tasked with coordinating with Range Officers.

A follow-up meeting with Range Officer Nongpoh in Ribhoi district is scheduled for February 25, 2024, involving community reserve beneficiaries from Umling, Umsning, Jirang, and Bhoirymbong blocks.

" "MegLIFE Garo Hills' VPIC Leaders' Exposure Trip to Kolkata "



The MegLIFE team from Garo Hills organized a four-day exposure trip to Kolkata for 23 VPIC leaders representing each of the VPICs from the Blocks of Samanda, Rongara, Baghmara, and Betasing. The trip took place from February 21st to 24th, 2024. A notable aspect was the exploration of a 15-hectare plantation project in Rakshitpur village managed by the Malandighi Beat and Durgapur Range, in collaboration with the Joint Forest Management Committee of Rakshitpur village. This project has successfully transformed previously barren land by strategically planting Sal trees and associated flora. The layout includes four lines of Sal trees alternated with four lines of Sal associates, aiming to increase greenery and foster biodiversity. VPIC leaders were accompanied by key officials such as the Forest Ranger of Durgapur, Shri Sudeep, and the Beat Officer of Malandighi, who shared insights into the plantation's establishment. The pr oject, initiated in 2018 as part of the WBFBDC project funded by JICA, has gained recognition as one of the region's finest, showcasing its effectiveness and influence.



On February 21, 2024, an audit was carried out within the SWGH District.



Community nurseries have been set up in different Blocks across various villages, managed by VPICs, to grow plants for the upcoming year 2024 in specified plantation areas.

MEGHALAYA BASIN MANAGEMENT AGENCY "Initiation and Progress of MegLIFE Springshed Management Training in Meghalaya"



On February 20, 2024, the MegLIFE project commenced its Orientation and Training sessions on Springshed Management in Meghalaya, held simultaneously in the Garo and Khasi/Jaintia/Ri Bhoi regions. The objective was to impart knowledge to participants about Springshed Management and Development within villages involved in the MegLIFE project. On Day 2, which took place on February 22, the Advanced Centre for Water Resources Development and Management (ACWADAM) team collaborated with Gambegre Block staff at Sisogre village to identify a crucial spring for comprehensive spring water rejuvenation efforts.



Activities included engaging in focus group discussions with the community, identifying springs, measuring discharge rates, and collecting data on salinity, TDS, temperature, and iron content. Furthermore, water samples were gathered to assess bacterial contamination using sulphide ion strip testing. Updates were also provided on Springshed Management in Chandigre VPIC Rongram block, with a particular focus on Sisogre and Gambegre. A two-day field survey for springshed management was successfully conducted at Mawtharap village under Mairang Block.
