



#### "Springshed Management Initiatives in MegLIFE: Enhancing Conservation Efforts in West Garo Hills and EWKH District"



The Springshed management team from MegLIFE engaged in various activities across different villages and blocks. They conducted spring inventories to identify critical springs in locations such as Gambarigre and Bugakolgre. Visits were made to villages like Jarimpara, Dana Bolongre, Nongsohma, Darengagre, Possengagre, and Umniangriang, where field surveys were carried out for Springshed Management in collaboration with MLSC, PSI, CHIRAG, and ACWADAM teams. Lithology studies and recharge intervention surveys were also conducted in some areas. These efforts aimed to enhance the management and conservation of springs in the region, particularly in the West Garo Hills District and EWKH District.

#### Community Engagement and Expansion of Plantation Efforts in Betasing and



Mobilization commenced for the Plantation area within Betasing Block on March 1, 2024. Additionally, an interaction took place with villagers from Waro Songital VPIC Chokpot regarding the plantation area. Initially, only 8 hectares were allocated for Agroforestry, but following discussions with villagers, they offered an additional 22 hectares, bringing the total to 30 hectares. A meeting was held on March 4, 2024, in Chokpot group 2, Emandurabanda village, where previously 13.55 hectares were designated for plantation, and now,

villagers are offering more land suitable for plantation. Program Associate Galwanggre A from Gambegre Block elucidated the LULC (Land Use and Land Cover) map on March 2, 2023, illustrating areas such as scrub land and open forest where plantation initiatives could be undertaken. Villagers expressed their willingness to contribute land for plantation efforts during this session.



Community nurseries have been set up in different Blocks across various villages, managed by VPICs, to grow plants for the upcoming year 2024 in specified plantation areas.

#### "Formation of Integrated Village Cooperative Societies (IVCS) in Resubelpara Block, North Garo Hills

District"



On March 4, 2024, the BPM from Resubelpara Block, North Garo Hills District, organized a meeting and awareness program about Integrated Village Cooperative Societies (IVCS). Around 70 villagers participated enthusiastically, expressing their keen interest in establishing an IVCS. They elected 50 promoters to assist in its formation. IVCS aims to provide financial services, particularly savings and credit, to its members, serving as a bank for farmers. Additionally, IVCS acts as a service provider for various stakeholders, facilitating better market access for farmers /Producers Groups/ Self Help Groups to sell their produce at higher prices and enhancing market linkages.

#### "Exposure Visit of MegLIFE Village Representatives to Tripura."



From the 4th to the 8th of March, representatives from MegLIFE villages in Dalu, Resubelpara, Umsning, and Umling blocks embarked on an exposure visit to Tripura.



On March 5, 2024, a visit was conducted to Dumindikgre Village in the Rongram block and Damjongre Village in the Selsella block, accompanied by Sir Ivan Arengh, the District Project Manager (DPM) of West Garo Hills (WGH). A meeting was convened with the communities to deliberate on various agroforestry models. Both villages expressed agreement to allocate more land for agroforestry, and plans were formulated to delineate the designated areas for this purpose.



### Protection of Vulnerable Catchment Areas in Meghalaya (MegARISE)





MegARISE staff, a KFW-funded project, had a meeting with the Chief Project Director of MegARISE, Shri Sampath Kumar, IAS, at the Secretariat in Shillong on March 6th, 2024. Shri Gunanka D.B., Additionally, Project Director of MegLIFE/MCLLMP/MegARISE, gave a short presentation on the progress status of the MegARISE-KFW project, during which several suggestions and inputs for involved departments were provided.

The staff present at the meeting included managers from different verticals such as GIS, KM, NRM, Social, and Capacity Building, including Shri James Kharkongor, DPD of MegARISE.


#### "Empowering Communities Through MRV Trainings and

under the PES Scheme can be determined. MRV has been carried out for 381 communities only, that received funding for Year 1 in December 2022. Out of these, 324 communities have been selected to receive funds for the Second Year. The MRV activity for 381 communities commenced on February 5, 2024, led by GREEN Field Associates at Block Level in collaboration with Village Community Facilitators (VCF), and completed on February 17, 2024. Note: Beneficiaries with missing data, falling under WLS, NP, RF, Not received funds in year 1 and 0% Payment are under Review.



On March 4th, 2024, the Honorable Chief Minister of Meghalaya, Shri Conrad K Sangma, officially inaugurated the Aromatic Plant-Based Sanitary Pads Unit in Rongdong, South Garo Hills District. With the introduction of the Re'King Sanitary Pad, a medicated sanitary napkin, that represents a significant stride toward improved health and opportunities for women. Developed and marketed by Dabram IVCS, this remarkable napkin incorporates a unique technology pioneered by CSIR CIMAP. The successful transfer of this technology, was facilitated by the Megh Aroma Mission of the Institute of Natural Resources. This accomplishment transcends the mere introduction of a napkin; it embodies the empowerment of rural women entrepreneurs. The Megh Aroma Mission plays a pivotal role in supporting these women, nurturing environmentally friendly and sustainable livelihoods within our state.
